**Jodie Riesenberger – National Parks Conservation Association**  
RMSLA President

Jodie is a program manager for the National Parks Conservation Association (NPCA), a national non-profit organization dedicated to protecting our national parks for future generations.

Jodie's career to date has focused on various aspects of the dynamic between humans and the environment. She has a background that includes both programmatic, and fundraising work in international development, population and conservation. Prior to joining NPCA, she worked at the Centre for Development and Population Activities (CEDPA) where she was responsible for foundation relations for the women-focused development organization working throughout the world. Prior to that she worked at Population Action International and Conservation International on population, health and environment issues.

**Stuart Conway – Trees, Water & People**

Stuart is the co-founder and International Director of Trees, Water & People, based in Fort Collins, Colorado. Previously he served for eight years as the Director of the Washington D.C. based New Forests Project where he initiated reforestation and watershed protection projects in Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, Haiti, Ethiopia and the Philippines. He also established two Regional Agro-forestry Training centers in Guatemala and El Salvador. Stuart received an **E-chievement** award in 2001 from **E-town**, a nationally renowned PBS radio program, for his tree planting and forest conservation efforts in Central America with TWP.

**Jennifer V. Orgolini - New Belgium Brewing**

Jenn has been with New Belgium since October 1993 and is one of only two employees who have advanced from the packaging line to the boardroom. She became New Belgium's first COO in 2004, having spent the prior four years as NBB's first CFO, during which time she launched New Belgium's Employee Stock Ownership Plan and secured significant financing for growth.

Since May, 2007, she's been creating New Belgium's first executive-level sustainability position, ensuring that New Belgium continues to be a green business role model. As the Steward of Sustainability, Jenn makes advises decision-makers on sustainable choices, presents New Belgium's sustainability accomplishments and philosophies outside the brewery in support of our advocacy goals, and works on project teams at New Belgium and in our community to continue to raise the bar.

**Lucinda Smith – City of Fort Collins Natural Resources**

Lucinda Smith has worked in public service (federal then local government) for over fifteen years. She has worked for the City of Fort Collins since 1996, where she manages the City's air quality program. She also coordinates the City's Sustainability Team and oversees the City's greenhouse gas reduction efforts. In this capacity, she works to raise awareness and build bridges to support sustainable actions. She serves on the Steering Committee for the Rocky Mountain Climate Organization. Prior to that, she coordinated a federally funded research project to monitor ecosystem impacts from climate change on Bureau of Land Management wild lands.

She has long been interested in environmental protection, and has volunteered on conservation issues locally with the Sierra Club. She also volunteered in the community delivering meals to

homebound citizens for several years. She periodically commutes to work by bike, loves outdoor activities, and seeks to live an increasingly sustainable lifestyle with her husband and two dogs in Loveland, Colorado.

As a grad student at CSU, John organized the very first Sustainable Living Fair in May 2000, attended by 300 people in the basement of the Student Center. In 2001 and 2002, John led the organizing committee to host the Sustainable Living Fair at the Lincoln Center in Fort Collins.

In November 2001, John and three other partners incorporated SunFuels, Inc. doing business as Blue Sun Biodiesel. John now serves as Director of Business Development for Blue Sun, focusing on regional expansion and distribution, retail pump openings, conference organizing, and speaking at seminars and events around the country. Currently, Blue Sun is developing a R&D seed program to achieve a low-cost, high-quality feedstock for commercial production, as well as building markets through a branded and exclusive distribution network.

John continues to serve on the Board of Directors for Blue Sun Biodiesel, the Rocky Mountain Sustainable Living Association, and Northern Colorado - Clean Cities.

**Morgan W. DeFoort – CSU Engines and Energy Conversion Lab**

Morgan DeFoort is the Associate Director of the Engines and Energy Conversion Laboratory at Colorado State University.
